As we shift from summer and go into fall and winter, there is unknown territory ahead as clinics prepare for winter scheduling. Over the past months, coordinators have adjusted how they interact and provide services, modify schedules and have used virtual and other models of completing assessments and diagnosis. There are so many telehealth and online options to get work done while remaining off-site from your office building and to connect safely with other team members, clients and staff. The advantages of having Zoom, Teams meetings, video conferencing and other means of communicating, without being face-face, enables clinics to continue to provide services. Many coordinators I've spoken to have embraced the challenges of doing things differently. There are efficiencies, cost and human resources savings and clients' satisfaction with the adjustments to the extent clinics will continue with different ways of delivering assessment and diagnostic services well after the pandemic is over.

The 2020 Annual Clinic Coordinator Meeting was held via Zoom on September 15th. The advantages of virtual meetings are obvious for those who have to travel long distances to attend a face to face meeting: less time away from other commitments; easier child care arrangements; costs savings; enables more coordinators to attend; shorter meeting. However, in person meetings have obvious benefits of connecting and networking with others during lunch and other breaks during the day and to have a targeted time away from the office, with no distractions. We'll survey coordinator's to see if virtual modes were positive ways to connect.

The Rajani Clinic Training Project continues to develop relevant resources and training. Top of the list will be a webinar this fall for those planning on using the University of Washington Facial Analysis software to measure sentinel facial features. As you can appreciate, the program is not easy to navigate and we want to ensure the training session will prepare those attending to move forward with confidence in using the software.

Affect Regulation Survey Results

Affect Regulation (AR) Screen, Assessment and Diagnostic Checklist for Pediatric FASD <u>Clinics</u>

In Fall of 2019, Alberta Pediatric FASD clinics were asked to provide information on how they assess the AR domain. Along with the checklist, links to recommended screening tools and diagnostic criteria for AR disorders were shared. Highlights from the responses:

- 6 Pediatric clinics participated; 101 individual checklists total submitted.
- Clinic dates ranged from September 2019 to August 2020.
- Child age range 5 years to 18 years; 36% female, 64% male.
- 15 children were diagnosed with an AR impairment prior to clinic; 15 children received an AR diagnosis at current clinic.
- 4 cases where a child received an AR diagnosis at clinic, and the AR domain was the 3rd domain, resulting in an FASD diagnosis.
- AR diagnoses assigned prior to, or at clinic, include: Major Depressive Disorder, Persistent Depressive Disorder, Disruptive Mood Dysregulation Disorder, Agoraphobia, Social Anxiety Disorder and Generalized Anxiety Disorder.
- Reg. Psychologist assigned the AR diagnosis (59%), Physician (31%), and Other (10%).
- Screening tools identified as used: SCARED (15%), PSC-17 (13%), Columbia Depression Scale (10%), Preschool Anxiety Scale (2%)
- Other Screening Tools commonly used: BASC-3, CDI-2, BDI-2, MASC-2, RCMAS-2, BRIEF-3.
- Many responses indicated no screening tools were used to assess for AR impairment, reporting their team did not feel it was relevant to assess the AR domain (40% of responses).
- Using screening tools often resulted in increased referrals for interventions (40% of responses).

We encourage the pediatric clinics to complete the checklist. This information will inform practices used to screen and asses this domain.



Annual Clinic Coordinator Meeting September 15, 2020

On September 15th, the annual FASD clinic coordinator meeting was held via a Zoom meeting. This was the 10th year of the annual meeting, and keeping pace with other years' great attendance, saw 30 people connect. Face to face meetings allow participants to network with others over breaks and lunch, but a virtual meeting was more economical, involved less travel time, and resulted in a shorter meeting. Guest speakers delivered relevant information for attendees: Melissa Tremblay, Ph.D. presented on Respectful Engagement with Indigenous Communities. Dr. Hasu Rajani, Pediatrician, presented information on Affect Regulation Screening, Assessment and Diagnosis-Considerations for FASD clinics. The Rajani Clinic Training Project is planning more events and training sessions over the next months, in light of increased use of virtual platforms to deliver services, and requests for training on use of the University of Washington Facial Analysis Software to measure sentinel facial features. List of Control Key Shortcuts

Ctrl+A These two keys will select all text or other objects.




CanFASD Research Network - Publications and Research:
